# OSA-A / Introduction to Osaka

Difficulty



Price: \$159 - Duration: 5.00 hr(s)

Explore Osaka's feudal and religious past during this picturesque, half-day sightseeing excursion.

Osaka, Osaka Castle, Weapons, Armour, Artefacts, Panoramic Viewpoint

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximate 50-minute drive to the Osaka Castle. Built in the late-16th century, the castle was burned down in a series of 17th-century battles. It was later reconstructed, but its donjon was destroyed by fire once again. The castle's final reconstruction took place in the early-20th century. Upon arrival, take a guided walking tour. The first seven floors of the castle display various weapons, armour, and artefacts of a bygone era. The eighth-floor features splendid panoramic vistas and photo opportunities of the castle's surrounds. Leaving Osaka Castle, re-board your coach for the drive to Sumiyoshiku and a visit to the Sumiyoshi Taisha Shrine.

Sumiyoshi Taisha Shrine, Four Sanctuaries, 600 Stone Garden Lanterns, Red, Arched Bridge

Built in the 3rd century, the shrine is beloved by the people of Osaka as the guardian deity for sailors and a deity to bring prosperity. It also serves as the headquarters of over 2,000 Sumiyoshi Taisha Shrines throughout Japan. Some three-million people visit this shrine at the beginning of each New Year. The shrine is home to the first-fourth sanctuaries. Each sanctuary is built in the Sumiyoshi-Zukuri style with straight roofs, the oldest Shrine architecture style, and all are designated as National Treasures. In the precincts surrounded by woods, over 600 stone garden lanterns stand in a row and a red, arched bridge spans over the pond. Following your visit, re-board your coach for the approximate 30-minute drive back to the pier.

Please note: This tour involves an extensive amount of walking for approximately two miles (about 3.2 kilometres), at times over uneven, cobblestone, and natural surfaces and inclines, with a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach, 40 steps at the entrance to the Osaka Castle, and 190 steps to access the top floor. This tour is not suitable for guests with limited mobility and guests who utilise a wheelchair. Guests are advised to wear lightweight, comfortable clothing with flat, closedtoe walking shoes, and bring sun protection, a sweater or light jacket, bottled water, and Japanese Yen or credit cards for purchases from the ship. Although credit cards are mostly accepted, Japanese Yen is required for any purchases; quests are advised to exchange money at the airport prior to the cruise. Proper attire is required to enter temples and shrines; shorts and bare shoulders are not permitted. Guests must be at least 12 years old to participate on this tour; minors must be accompanied by a parent or guardian over 18 years old. Guests must be at least 20 years old to be served alcoholic beverages. Infrastructure in Osaka may be basic, and local conditions may be challenging; coaches, guides, hotels, restaurants, equipment, and services are the best-available in the area, but may not be up to the standards of those found on other ports. Therefore, we urge flexibility and understanding as we visit unique, less-touristic destinations. # OSA-B / Kyoto Highlights & High-Speed Shinkansen Train

Difficulty

Experience Kyoto on the fast track during a panoramic, full-day sightseeing excursion to this historic city via bullet train. Osaka, Bullet Train to Kyoto, Golden Pavilion

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximately 45-minute drive to the Shin-Osaka Station. Upon arrival, board the high-speed Shinkansen bullet train for the short ride to Kyoto. Upon arrival at the Kyoto Station, board a coach and transfer to the Kinkaku-ji Temple (Golden Pavilion) for an exterior visit. Built as a villa during the Muromachi Period in 1397, this UNESCO World Heritage Site was later converted into a temple. The temple burned down in 1950 and was rebuilt in 1955. It is approximately 41 feet (about 12.5 metres) in height, and the second-and-third storeys are covered with approximately two tons (about 1.8 metric tons) of pure gold foil. The mirror reflection on the still pond in the garden is a marvellous site to behold.

Nijo Castle, Cultural Treasures, Chinese Gate, Ni-no-maru Garden, Pictures on Doors

Next, re-board your coach and head to the Nijo Castle, built in 1626 as the residence of Shogun Tokugawa leyasu. The Honmaru (Main Court) burned down in 1788. The only original part remaining is the Ni-no-maru (Second Court). The present 'Honmaru', built in 1827, is a replica of the one that originally stood on the grounds of the Kyoto Imperial Palace. The castle, an UNESCO World Heritage Site, is also renowned for its many cultural treasures dating from the 16th-century Momoyama Era, including the Karamon (Chinese Gate), Ni-no-maru Garden, and pictures on the doors of the building.

Shozan Resort Kyoto, Japanese Lunch, Heian Jingu Shrine

Leaving Nijo Castle, re-board your coach and proceed for a Japanese, set-menu lunch at the Shozan Resort Kyoto. After lunch, re-board your coach and transfer to the Heian Shrine (Shrine of Peace), built in 1895 to commemorate the 1,100th anniversary of the founding of Kyoto (Heian-Kyo capital). The Heian Shrine is dedicated to two emperors: Emperor Kammu, the first emperor to rule Kyoto, and Emperor Komei, the last emperor to live out his reign in the city.

Afterward, re-board your coach and commence the approximately 1.5-hour drive back to the pier. A comfort stop is made en route

Guests are advised to wear lightweight, comfortable clothing with flat, closed-toe walking shoes, and bring sun protection, a sweater or light jacket, bottled water, and Japanese Yen or credit cards for purchases from the ship. Proper attire is required to enter temples and shrines; shorts and bare shoulders are not permitted. Guests must remove their shoes before entering the Ninomaru Palace at the Nijo Castle. Guests must be at least 20 years old to be served alcoholic beverages. # OSA-C / The Spirit of Japan: Nara & Kyoto

Discover the essence of Japanese culture and history through this captivating tour of Nara and Kyoto's most revered sites on this full-day cultural exploration tour. It offers a perfect balance of Nara's ancient grandeur and Kyoto's refined beauty, providing a comprehensive insight into Japan's spiritual and cultural heritage. From the largest bronze Buddha to the most enigmatic rock garden, every stop on this journey promises to leave you with lasting memories and a deeper understanding of Japanese history and aesthetics.

Nara, Todaiji Temple, Great Buddha Hall

Disembark the ship and board your motorized coach for an approximately one hour drive to Nara, where your journey begins at the awe-inspiring Todaiji Temple. Founded in 752 AD and designated a UNESCO World Heritage Site, Todaiji is one of Japan's most historically significant temples. Its vast Daibutsuden, or Great Buddha Hall, is the largest wooden structure in the world and houses an immense bronze statue of Buddha Vairocana rising 15 meters tall. As you explore the temple grounds, enjoy encounters with the friendly deer that wander freely here, long regarded as sacred messengers of the gods.

Local Lunch

A short transfer then brings you to a local restaurant for a traditional Japanese lunch, where the fresh flavors of the region provide both nourishment and a glimpse into Kyoto's celebrated culinary heritage.

Kyoto, Golden Pavillion

Following lunch, relax on an approximately one hour and fifteen-minute drive to Kyoto, where the shimmering Golden Pavilion (Kinkaku-ji) awaits. This exquisite three-story temple, covered entirely in gold leaf, was originally built in 1397 as the retirement villa of Shogun Ashikaga Yoshimitsu before becoming a Zen temple. Reflected in the still waters of its surrounding pond, the Golden Pavilion is one of Kyoto's most iconic and unforgettable sights.

Iconic Zen Rock Garden, Ryoanji Temple

Your final stop is Ryoanji Temple, home to Japan's most famous Zen rock garden. With its 15 carefully placed stones set upon a sea of white gravel, this minimalist masterpiece has inspired contemplation and debate for centuries. The wider temple grounds, featuring a scenic pond and lush seasonal gardens, invite quiet reflection before your return journey. At the end of your visit, re-board your coach for the approximately one hour and forty-minute transfer back to the port, where your ship awaits your return and the day's memories linger.

Please note: This tour involves an extensive amount of walking for approximately 2.5 miles (about four kilometres), at times over uneven, cobblestone, and natural surfaces and inclines, with a few steps to negotiate to get on/off the coach, 20 steps at the Todaiji Temple. This tour is not suitable for guests prone to motion sickness, guests with limited mobility, and guests who utilise a wheelchair. Guests are advised to wear lightweight, comfortable clothing with flat, closed-toe walking shoes, and bring sun protection, a sweater or light jacket, bottled water, and Japanese Yen or credit cards for purchases from the ship. Although credit cards are mostly accepted, Japanese Yen is required for any purchases; guests are advised to exchange money at the airport prior to the cruise. Proper attire is required to enter temples and shrines; shorts and bare shoulders are not permitted. Guests must be at least 12 years old to participate on this tour; minors must be accompanied by a parent or guardian over 18 years old. Guests must be at least 20 years old to be served alcoholic beverages. # OSA-D / The View of Osaka

Difficulty

Experience the stunning beauty and history of Osaka from two unique perspectives during this panoramic, half-day sightseeing excursion.

Shitenno-ji Temple, 6th-Century Temple Buildings

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximately 30-minute drive to the Shitenno-ji Temple, built in the late-6th century by a son of Emperor Yomei. One of Japan's oldest temples, Shittenno-ji was the first to be built by the state and founded in 593 by Prince Shotoku, who supported the introduction of Buddhism into Japan. Whilst several of the temple's buildings have burned down several times throughout the centuries, they have always been carefully reconstructed to reflect the original, 6th-century design.

Outer Temple Grounds, Interior Tour, Gokuraku-jodo Garden, Pagoda, Main Hall, Kannon Statue

Upon arrival, take a guided walking tour around the outer temple grounds. Once inside the temple, see the Gokuraku-jodo Garden, the pebble-covered courtyard with a five-storey pagoda, and the Main Hall where Prince Shotoku is enshrined as a statue of Kannon. Sakai City \ The Art of Japanese Knives

We begin our day in Sakai, just south of Osaka, to visit the Sakai Denshokan, a museum dedicated to one of the city's traditional crafts \ knife making. Sakai knives are coveted by chefs from around the world who value their precision and quality as well as the history and lore surrounding these special tools. This is followed by a visit to a famous and ancient producer of Japanese knives. We'll learn about the craft of hand-forged knives, central to the cooking of Japan, a tradition that dates to the 15<sup>th</sup> century, and hear from the artisans at work. Of course, you will have a chance to take home one of these pieces of functional art.

At these stops, we'll also meet Eric Chevallier, a French-born bladesmith and Japanese knife expert and connoisseur who will talk about the role these tools play in the cuisine.

Introduction to Kombu \ Kombu Facility

We follow this with an exploration of kombu (sea kelp), a key ingredient in dashi, the basic building block of Japanese cuisine. Geishas are professional entertainers who attend to guests during meals and other occasions, and have been wearing kimonos since the Edo Period (1603 A.D.-1867 A.D.). They are regarded as 'traditional and iconic Japanese women' who have learned graceful behaviour, traditional customs, and various Japanese arts such as dancing and playing musical instruments. The role of the Geisha is to make guests feel at ease with conversation, using special dialects, drinking games, and dance performances. At the conclusion of this special occasion, re-board your coach and transfer back to your hotel.

More than 10,000 red-painted Torii gates straddling the approximately 2.5-mile (about four-kilometre) path up the hill behind it were donated by the faithful, as were the many stone statues of foxes, messengers of the Inari Taisha Shrine.

Discover the Sanjusangendo Temple, a National Treasure

Leaving the Fushimi Inari Taisha Shrine, re-board your coach and head to the Sanjusangendo Temple, a National Treasure. This temple is famous by a seated, thousand-armed Kannon, the Goddess of Mercy, and more than 1,000 small statues of Kannon in the Main Hall. The temple derives its name from the 33 spaces between the pillars in front of the main altar. In Buddhism, the number '33' is of symbolic importance. The bodhisattva Kannon incarnates in 33 different shapes in its missions of mercy.

Visit the Tenryuji Temple, an UNESCO World Heritage Site

# OSA-A / Introduction to Osaka

Difficulty

Explore Osaka's feudal and religious past during this picturesque, half-day sightseeing excursion.

Osaka, Osaka Castle, Weapons, Armour, Artefacts, Panoramic Viewpoint

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximate 50-minute drive to the Osaka Castle. Built in the late-16th century, the castle was burned down in a series of 17th-century battles. It was later reconstructed, but its donjon was destroyed by fire once again. The castle's final reconstruction took place in the early-20th century. Upon arrival, take a guided walking tour. The first seven floors of the castle display various weapons, armour, and artefacts of a bygone era. The eighth-floor features splendid panoramic vistas and photo opportunities of the castle's surrounds. Leaving Osaka Castle, re-board your coach for the drive to Sumiyoshiku and a visit to the Sumiyoshi Taisha Shrine.

Sumiyoshi Taisha Shrine, Four Sanctuaries, 600 Stone Garden Lanterns, Red, Arched Bridge

Built in the 3rd century, the shrine is beloved by the people of Osaka as the guardian deity for sailors and a deity to bring prosperity. It also serves as the headquarters of over 2,000 Sumiyoshi Taisha Shrines throughout Japan. Some three-million people visit this shrine at the beginning of each New Year. The shrine is home to the first-fourth sanctuaries. Each sanctuary is built in the Sumiyoshi-Zukuri style with straight roofs, the oldest Shrine architecture style, and all are designated as National Treasures. In the precincts surrounded by woods, over 600 stone garden lanterns stand in a row and a red, arched bridge spans over the pond. Following your visit, re-board your coach for the approximate 30-minute drive back to the pier.

# OSA-B / Kyoto Highlights & High-Speed Shinkansen Train

Experience Kyoto on the fast track during a panoramic, full-day sightseeing excursion to this historic city via bullet train. Osaka, Bullet Train to Kyoto, Golden Pavilion

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximately 45-minute drive to the Shin-Osaka Station. Upon arrival, board the high-speed Shinkansen bullet train for the short ride to Kyoto. Upon arrival at the Kyoto Station, board a coach and transfer to the Kinkaku-ji Temple (Golden Pavilion) for an exterior visit. The mirror reflection on the still pond in the garden is a marvellous site to behold.

Nijo Castle, Cultural Treasures, Chinese Gate, Ni-no-maru Garden, Pictures on Doors

Next, re-board your coach and head to the Nijo Castle, built in 1626 as the residence of Shogun Tokugawa leyasu. The Honmaru (Main Court) burned down in 1788. The only original part remaining is the Ni-no-maru (Second Court). The present 'Honmaru', built in 1827, is a replica of the one that originally stood on the grounds of the Kyoto Imperial Palace. The castle, an UNESCO World Heritage Site, is also renowned for its many cultural treasures dating from the 16th-century Momoyama Era, including the Karamon (Chinese Gate), Ni-no-maru Garden, and pictures on the doors of the building.

Shozan Resort Kyoto, Japanese Lunch, Heian Jingu Shrine

Leaving Nijo Castle, re-board your coach and proceed for a Japanese, set-menu lunch at the Shozan Resort Kyoto. After lunch, re-board your coach and transfer to the Heian Shrine (Shrine of Peace), built in 1895 to commemorate the 1,100th anniversary of the founding of Kyoto (Heian-Kyo capital). The Heian Shrine is dedicated to two emperors: Emperor Kammu, the first emperor to rule Kyoto, and Emperor Komei, the last emperor to live out his reign in the city.

#### HIJ-F / Peace Memorial Park & Museum

Each of the floats are decorated with traditional figures and scenes and are up to 10 meters tall and weigh 1 ton. One of the huge floats is on permanent display in the shrine grounds.

Your last stop is Fukuoka Tower. It was built in 1989 for the Yokatopia Expo that was held to commemorate the 100th anniversary of municipalizing Fukuoka as a city. The tower stands 234 meters high and is Japan's tallest seaside tower. From the observation platform at 123 meters above the ground, visitors enjoy a 360 degree panoramic view that covers the city of Fukuoka to Hakata Bay.

The museum building itself is a massive blue construction that resembles a sports stadium more than an exhibition space. The museum's appearance is made even more striking by the fact that it is located in a city as small as Dazaifu. Upon first entering the building visitors will surely be impressed by the spacious entrance hall. The main exhibition is on the fourth floor and is divided into five chronological sections that span Japanese history from the Prehistoric Era to the Edo Period(1603-1868). The sections are further divided into smaller rooms that have a unifying theme. The museum has an impressive collection of artifacts that are presented in both a creative and informative fashion.

#### BUS-A / Introduction to Busan

The Outdoor Exhibition Hall is home to precious pagodas, Buddhist statues, and monuments. A new exhibition hall displays a wide array of relics from the Prehistoric Age to modern times. Next, re-board your coach and head to the Jagalchi Fish Market. This bustling, harbour-side market stretches into the downtown area and offers fresh seafood, including a large shellfish section in the middle of the market.

Guided Tour, Fresh Seafood & Shellfish, Gukje Market (International Market), Free Time, Shopping

During your guided visit, the mountains of fresh seafood and shellfish on ice, sea air, and resonant voices of the market folk combine to create an unforgettable experience. Your final stop is at the Gukje Market. Busan's largest and most central market area, it was formed by merchants descended from refugees of the Korean War. The alleyways are divided into six market districts offering a wide array of goods, including silk, linen, clothing, bags, glasses, and curtains. Following a short, guided tour, some free time is made available for shopping at your leisure. At the conclusion of your visit, re-board your coach and commence the short drive back to the pier.

Busan, Gyeongju

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximately 1.5-hour drive through the city and countryside en route to Gyeongju. Located on the eastern coast where the morning sunlight first touches the Orient, Gyeongju was formerly the capital of the Shilla Kingdom, and centre of Korea, when Shilla unified the peninsula in 676 A.D. An UNESCO World Heritage Site, Gyeongju was also designated by UNESCO as one of the world's ten most historically significant sites and is known as the 'museum without walls'. Bulguksa Temple, Local Restaurant, Traditional Korean Bulgogi Lunch

Upon arrival at Gyeongju, your first stop is at the Bulguksa Temple, an UNESCO World Heritage Site and one of Korea's best-known temples. Located on the western slope of Mt. Tohamsan, the Bulguksa Temple is a monument to both the skill of the Shilla architects and depth of Buddhist faith at the time. Whilst most of the wooden buildings have been rebuilt over the centuries, all of the stone bridges, stairways and pagodas are original. Following your visit, re-board your coach and proceed for a traditional Korean bulgogi (marinated beef) lunch at a local restaurant.

Gyeongju National Museum, Gold Crowns, Buddhist Artefacts, Stone Sculptures, Emuille Bell

After lunch, re-board your coach and head to the Gyeongju National Museum. A place of compelling interest, the National Museum, preserves much of the Shilla heritage, including magnificent gold crowns, pottery, Buddhist artefacts, and stone sculptures. The museum also houses the Divine Bell of King Seongdeok the Great, also referred to as the legendary Emuille

Bell. One of Asia's largest and most resonant bells, the Emuille Bell is comprised of approximately 19 tons (about 17.2 tonnes) of bronze and stands approximately 11 feet (about 3.4 metres) in height.

Tumuli Park, Royal Shilla Tombs, Flying Horse Tomb, Artefacts

Leaving the museum, re-board your coach and transfer to Tumuli Park, a collection of royal Shilla tombs located in the middle of Gyeongju. The park contains 20 tombs, of which the Chonmachong Tomb (Flying Horse Tomb) is the most famous. Its name comes from the picture of a flying horse found painted on white birch bark when the tomb was excavated in 1974, and subsequently yielded more than 11,500 artefacts. At the conclusion of your tour, re-board your coach and commence the approximately 1.5-hour drive back to the pier.

## KAN-A / Highlights of Kanazawa & Tea Ceremony Experience

Traditional Art & Craft Museum of Ishikawa

Depart the pier for the scenic, approximate 30-minute drive to Traditional Art & Craft of Ishikawa. The museum is the only one place where 36 designated traditional crafts produced in Ishikawa prefecture are displayed. The keyword for this museum is the beauty of clothes, food, lifestyle, praying, play, music and festival.

Kenroku-en Garden, Japanese Lunch

Next stop is Kenroku-en, one of the three celebrated "Great Gardens of Japan." This 25-acre landscape garden was originally developed by the great daimyo of Kanazawa Castle. Kenroku-en boasts Japan's first fountain, a teahouse dating to 1774, and a pagoda donated to the Maeda clan by the great warlord Toyotomi Hideyoshi. The celebrated Ganko-bashi is a bridge comprising 11 red stones laid out to resemble a formation of flying geese. Next, re-board your coach for a short drive to a local restaurant for a Japanese set-menu lunch.

Gyokusen-An for Tea Ceremony

After lunch, head to Gyokusen-an for a traditional tea ceremony. It offers a pleasant view of the garden. Here we take the opportunity to see an authentic tea ceremony performance.

Higashi Chaya District

Your final destination is the Higashi Chayamachi, where feudal times preserved with its wooden latticed houses and winding, narrow streets. Homes are still in use and well preserved by residents, maintaining the atmosphere of bygone days. Walking down the street one can almost imagine the sounds of Japanese shamisen and drums.

After a cheerful walk of Higashi Chaya District re-board, the coach commences the approximately 30 minutes' drive back to the port and to your ship.

Please note: This tour involves a moderate to extensive amount of walking (approximately 2.2km or 1.36miles) over cobblestones, unpaved and paved walkways, with around 30 steps at the various sites and a few to negotiate to get on/off the coach. This tour is not suitable for guests with limited mobility and guests who utilize a wheelchair. Lightweight, comfortable clothing, flat, closed-toe walking shoes and sun protection are recommended. Guests will be asked to remove their own shoes at Gyokusen-an for the tea ceremony. The maximum capacity of the teahouse is 15-17 guests so the group will be split accordingly. ## KAN-B / UNESCO World Heritage Villages of Shirakawago & Gokayama

Experience the rich architectural traditions of the Japanese countryside on a tour including two of the region's most picturesque villages.

Shirakawago Village

Shirakawago widely known as one of the most scenic places in Japan, is surrounded by dramatic pine tree-covered mountains. After an approximately 90 minutes journey, arrive to Shirakawago Village. Here you'll find the unique Japanese thatched-roof farmhouses that are the center of attention. There are approximately 90 thatched farmhouses, sheds, and barns built about 200-300 years ago that were added to UNESCO'S World Heritage List in 1995. They are examples of the Gassho-zukuri style, a form of construction that resembles hands-clasped in prayer. Aesthetically pleasing, the steeply pitched roofs are extremely practical during the heavy snowstorms of the Shokawa River valley. Pitched at 60 degrees and oriented along a north-south axis, the farmhouses are able to more efficiently capture sunlight and shed weighty burdens.

Farmhouse Visit, Local Lunch

After your guided tour of the farmhouse, enjoy some free time in the village. Next, re-board the coach and your tour continue to Gokayama. Prior arrival you'll be taken to a local restaurant for a local set-menu lunch.

Gokayama Village, Local Activities

After lunch an approximately half hour drive will take you to Gokayama Washinosato.

Like Shirakawago, Gokayama earned its place as a UNESCO World Cultural Heritage Site in 1995 and boasts the same style of Gassho-zukuri pitched-roof construction. Arriving in this charming village, you'll proceed to a special site where you'll be treated to fascinating demonstrations of the art of Japanese paper making. Known as washi, the process of creation is long and involved and that often undertaken in the depth of winter. The cold weather inhibits bacteria, prevents decomposition, makes the fibers contract for a crisp feel, and provides farmers with a source of winter income.

The kozo tree, or paper mulberry, is the most commonly used fiber in making Japanese paper. The kozo branches are boiled and stripped of their outer bark and then dried. The fibers are then boiled with lye to remove the starch, fat and tannin and any remaining impurities in the fibers are picked out by hand. The kozo is laid on a rock or board and beaten. Wet balls of pulp are mixed in a vat with water and one of two traditional methods of paper making (nagashi-zuki or tame-zuki) is employed. In both methods, pulp is scooped onto a screen and shaken to spread the fibers evenly. Nagashi-zuki (which uses neri in the vat) produces thinner paper, while tame-zuki (which does not use neri) produces thicker paper.

You'll have the unique opportunity to lend a hand in the process of Japanese papermaking, enjoying the camaraderie of this shared activity.

Upon conclusion of this unique experience, re-board your coach and commence the approximately 90-minute journey to the pier via the breathtaking Japanese countryside.

Please note: This tour involves a moderate to extensive amount of walking (approximately 2.2km or 1.36miles) over cobblestones and unpaved walkways, with around 20 steps at the various sites and a few to negotiate to get on/off the coach. This tour is not suitable for guests with guests with limited mobility and guests who utilise a wheelchair. #### Gold Leaf Experience

A gold leaf is made by beating gold into an extremely thin sheet with a thickness of 0.1 to 0.125 millionths of a meter. It is so thin that it will disappear when you rub it with your fingers. The production of gold leaf started in Kanazawa at the end of the 16th century, and it is produced more than 98% in Kanazawa.

Nagamachi District

Next stop is in the famous Nagamachi District. Nagamachi was a samurai district located at the foot of the former Kanazawa Castle, where samurai and their families used to reside. The area preserves a historic atmosphere with its remaining samurai residences, earthen walls, private entrance gates, narrow lanes and water canals. One of the main attractions of the district is the centrally located Nomura Samura House, a restored samurai residence displaying the lifestyle and artifacts of the era when samurai were prosperous.

Higashi Chaya Geisha District

And at the end of the tour drive to the Higashi Chaya Geisha District. A Chaya means teahouse is an exclusive type of restaurant where guests are entertained by geisha who perform song and dance. During the Edo Period, chaya were found in designated entertainment districts, usually just outside the city limits. The largest one of the chaya districts in Kanazawa is the Higashi Chaya district. Kenroku-en Garden

Kenroku-en boasts Japan's first fountain, a teahouse dating to 1774, and a pagoda donated to the Maeda clan by the great warlord Toyotomi Hideyoshi. The celebrated Ganko-bashi is a bridge comprising 11 red stones laid out to resemble a formation of flying geese.

Higashi Chaya Geisha District

Proceed to Higashi Chaya Geisha District. A Chaya means teahouse is an exclusive type of restaurant where guests are entertained by geisha who perform songs and dance. During the Edo Period, Chaya was found in designated entertainment districts, usually just outside the city limits. The largest one of the chaya districts in Kanazawa is the Higashi Chaya district. The construction of two-story houses except teahouses was prohibited in the Edo period. Homes are still in use and well preserved by residents, maintaining the atmosphere of at that time. Now many craft shops ideal for souvenir shopping are located in the area. Enjoy some free time for own exploration.

Immerse in the heritage and culture of the Fukui Prefecture as you discover Eiheiji Temple, a headquarters of Zen Buddhism, and then continue to the birthplace of Echizen lacquerware and a village devoted to traditional metalworking.

Temple of Eternal Peace

Depart the pier for a scenic, approximately 90-minute drive to visit Eiheiji, which translates to 'Temple of Eternal Peace'. This large temple complex nestled on a cedar-covered mountain slope just outside the city of Fukui was founded by Dogen Zenji, the Buddhist scholar who introduced Soto Zen to Japan in the early 13th century. Featuring a network of more than 70 buildings, each connected to the other by covered walkways, the temple continues to serve as a tranquil training center for Zen Buddhism.

Reception Hall, Buddha Hall, Founder's Hall, Lecture Hall, Lunch

Upon arrival, enter the Reception Hall to begin your tour of such key rooms as the Buddha Hall, with its three statues of Buddhas past, present, and future; the Founder's Hall, which contains the ashes of Dogen Zenji; and the Lecture Hall, where the monks learn the teachings of Buddha. As you explore this sacred site, take a moment to savour the intricate beauty of its traditional Japanese architecture, set amid the surrounding majesty of nature.

Next, re-board your coach for the short drive to a nearby restaurant for lunch.

Echizen Lacquerware Hall

#### HKD-A / Introduction to Hakodate

#### **Hakodate Morning Market**

Depart the pier for the brief walk to the Hakodate Morning Market. #### Goryokaku Park and Tower

Next, board your coach and drive to Goryokaku Park. The park is home to the remaining walls of Japan's first Western-style fort. The fort is named Goryokaku, or 'Pentagon Fort' due to its star shape. Nothing is left of the citadel, which was constructed by the Togukawa Shogunate to defend Japan against the threats from the north. Hakodate City Museum of Northern Peoples

Depart the pier for the morning drive into Hakodate and the Hakodate City Museum of Northern Peoples, which is located in an old bank building on the Motoi-zaka slope leading away from the consulate. During your visit, you view exhibits of valuable tools and ethnological materials that were collected over many years by Professors Osamu Baba and Sakuzaemon Kodama, and used by the Ainu people in their daily life. Learn about the people across Eastern Siberia and the Alaskan Islands.

Mount Hakodate

Next, your drive proceeds up to the Mount Hakodate Overlook, or 'Hakodateyama'. Reaching the summit with theHakodate Ropeway(cable car), arrive at the observatory at 1,100 feet (335 metres) for panoramic views over the surrounding area. After admiring the vista, drive back to downtown Hakodate to the Kanemori Red Brick Warehouse district.

Kanemori Red Brick Warehouse Area

This waterfront area was once the site of shipyards and foreign settlements and since about 1879, it prospered as a warehouse zone. The original buildings were destroyed by fire but were rebuilt in 1909. The Kanemori logo on these buildings once symbolized the trade-port of Hakodate. Re-modeled in 1988 as part of a waterfront area redevelopment with a theme of 'the old and the new', these buildings house shops, restaurants, galleries and meeting areas, while still offering a glimpse into Hakodate's golden age of shipping.

Following some free time to explore, re-board your coach for the return drive to the pier.

(Hakodate cable car will not be operated due to the bad weather. In this case, the tour will go up/ down to Mt. Hakodate by bus and may partially vary the tour itinerary)

Please note: This tour involves a moderate amount of walking for approximately 1 mile (1.6 kilometres), with 40 steps at the aerial cable car on Mt. Hakodate and up to 70 steps at the top of the mountain as well as 40 steps at the museum. This tour is suitable for guests who utilise a wheelchair but must be able to embark and disembark the coach on their own. Guests are advised to wear lightweight, comfortable clothing, and bring a sweater or jacket as it may be cool at the summit. #### MYW-A / Morioka Hachiman Shrine & Nanbu Ironware

Difficulty

Discover the traditions of Morioka, the largest city in the Iwate prefecture. The tour features sake making and ironware which has been the two well-known crafts of the city.

#### Morioka Hachimangu Shrine

Depart from the pier by coach and drive to Morioka. Start off by paying homage to the guardian deity of city at the Morioka Hachimangu Shrine. Established by feudal lord Nanbu Shigenobu in 1680 as the guardian shrine of the then Morioka domain and its people, the shrine has been revered by the locals since, with the shrine housing 12 different deities all believed to be efficacious for different aspects of life.

#### Asabiraki Sake Brewery Tour, Japanese style lunch

Visit and learn about Japanese sake (rice wine) at the Asabiraki Sake Brewery established in 1871, during the Meiji Era. Take a short brewery tour and enjoy some sake samples. Morioka historically has been known for quality sake thanks to its rich production of rice and water source. The shop located in the brewery property offers a wide selection of not only the sake made at the Asabiraki brewery but also local food products related to sake.

#### Iwachu Nanbu Ironware Factory Museum

The Nanbu Ironware is best known for high-quality teapots which are known for its ability to maintain the temperature once heated and the rough texture of the surface preventing the content from burning out. The Iwachu Nanbu Ironware Factory Museum showcases the traditional process of the ironware as well as some contemporary productions using the traditional techniques developed over the years. See an example of Japanese craftsmanship evolving to serve the needs of everyday life in the present era. At the end of your visit you will have a chance to shop for a product which you might find functional for your everyday life as well!

Having completed your visit, return to the pier.

## MYW-B / Miyako Geo Park

Miyako, a city located in the center of the coastal Iwate Prefecture, suffered devastating damage from the earthquake and tsunami of 2011. Seawater swept across the city's coastal districts, destroying everything in its path. Your tour takes you to the Jodogahama area which boasts picturesque scenery with the jagged rocks protruding from the sea.

Head to Jodogahama Beach for a photo stop. The name derives from a Buddhist monk from the 17th century comparing the landscape to the idea of "Jodo" or "Pure Land" which is believed to be one of the Buddhist versions of paradise. It is a National Scenic Reserve, known for the beautiful white-pebble beach that creates a striking contrast against the deep blue ocean. The pine trees which grow on top of the rocks enhance the landscape. The area was critically affected by the tsunami of March 11th, 2011 as the tidal waves carried debris from destroyed buildings and covered the entire beach. However, locals worked to remove the debris and preserve the iconic landscape of their hometown.

#### Michinoeki Taro

Stop by at Michinoeki Taro, which was newly built in 2018 as a symbol of the area's recovery from the tsunami impact. The facility sells local produce.

#### Sanno-iwa Rocks

Drive further up north to take in the unique view of the Sanno-iwa rocks which consist of the Otoko-iwa, Onna-iwaandTaiko-iwa. These rocks were first formed through volcanic activities in the area, and then sediments deposited onto the ocean floor which eventually were exposed to the wind and waves to be carved out into their shapes today.

#### Miyako Gyosai Fish Market

Finally you will visit the Miyako Gyosai Fish Market. Miyako City is home to a vibrant fishing industry that harvests a large variety of seafood from the waters along the Sanriku Coast. The Miyako Gyosai Fish Marketis one of the city's public markets.

The market is packed tightly with rows of vendors selling all sorts of fish, seafood, vegetables and fruits. Much of the seafood is freshly brought in from Miyako Port. In addition to the larger stalls, the market reserves one section for local farmer's to directly sell their produce to market visitors.

#### Ryusendo Cave

A seemingly fathomless subterranean world of its own, more than 2.5 miles has been discovered out of which 0.4 miles is open to the public. See the clear blue underground lakes and stalagmites that constitute this mystical world that expands underground.

After your underground adventure, reboard your coach for the return to the port.

Enjoy the magnificent view of the beach and the contrast between white rock and green trees ashore. You would find a huge rock, called 'Candle Rock' during the cruising.

#### Taro Kanko Hotel

Depart the pier for the 30 minute journey to the Taro Kanko Hotel, which was one of the very few structures that remained intact after the tsunami washed through the town. Spend approximately one hour with your guide. The first two floors of the hotel were completely washed away with only the pillars remaining. The upper floors have been preserved and are now open to the public to provide information on disaster prevention. A local guide will join you and will share with you what happened on March 11th, 2011 and after. Brace for an explicit video showing footage of the tsunami washing out the town.

Take in the view of the Sanno-iwa rocks which consist of Otoko-iwa, Onna-iwa and Taiko-iwa. These rocks were first formed through volcanic activity in the area, and then sediments deposited onto the ocean floor which eventually were exposed to the wind and waves to be carved out into the shapes that they are today.

#### Michinoeki Taro

Stop at Michinoeki Taro, which was newly built in 2018 as a symbol of the area's recovery from the tsunami impact. The facility sells local produces as well as offer educational activities for disaster prevention.

#### Jodogahama

The final visit of the day is Jodogahama. It got its name as resembling the idea of Buddhist paradise "Jodo" or "Pure Land". The jagged rocks line up to create an unusual landscape, with the contrast between the white sand and the deep blue of the ocean The area was critically affected by the tsunami of March 11th, 2011 as the tidal waves carried debris from destroyed buildings and covered the entire beach

However, locals worked to remove the debris and preserve the iconic landscape of Miyako.

Miyako Gyosai Fish Market

Following your visit to Jyodogahama Beach, your tour concludes with a short visit to Miyako Gyosai Fish Market. Miyako City is home to a vibrant fishing industry that harvests a large variety of seafood from the waters along the Sanriku Coast. Due to its inland location, it escaped direct damage by the 2011 Tsunami. The market is packed tightly with rows of vendors selling all sorts of fish, seafood, vegetables and fruits. Much of the seafood is freshly brought in from Miyako Port. In addition to the larger stalls, the market reserves one section for local farmer's to directly sell their produce to market visitors. Return to the pier.
